The Prize is endowed with 8.000 Euro.

The Prize will be awarded for outstanding scientific achievement to scholars from the countries of Eastern and Southeastern Europe. It is intended as recognition of excellent work and as encouragement for future high quality work as well. The Prize is not a lifetime achievement award.
